Before Israel's Existence

- Football in Palestine, 1900–1948: By the British Mandate period, football (soccer) was the most popular game in Palestine, played on streets and in schools and clubs.
- 1920, the British established the Jerusalem Sports Club
 - Football
- Under developed because of political instability
- Before 1948 65 athletic clubs existed in Israel
- Maccabiah held in Tel Aviv in 1932 and 1935
 - Jewish Nationalism
- Sports were not what they were concerned about
- Jews were worried about their existence in their fight for Israel. Sports were not the concern in Israel

Maccabi Games Between 1950-1980

First Maccabi games (1950) - 19 countries, 800 athletes

Seventh Maccabi Game(1965)- 25 countries, 1200 athletes

Ninth Maccabi Games (1973) - 27 counties, 1500 athletes

Tenth Maccabi Games(1977)- 33 countries, 2700 athletes
